

Where do you come in?

Each field trip of 50 to 100 students will consist of 3 to 6 groups of approximately 15 students moving through activity stations throughout the museum. You will help lead facilitated discussions and hands-on activities based on the subject of the field trip: Ohio History, Ohio Geography, or Ohio Economics.

- 3 schools, 3 field trips each
- 9 total field trips starting in November/December– February/March


